Biomethane, Explained

Sources of Biomethane: Agriculture

Farm animals produce a lot of manure. There are around 980 million pigs, 1.5 billion cows, and 24 billion poultry living on farms around the world. All told, they produce about 77 million tonnes of manure every single day. Right now, the lion's share of that manure releases methane back into the atmosphere.

Anaerobic digesters can capture a lot of that wasted methane, turning it into usable biogas. What's more, farms can often increase the efficiency of those digesters by including other types of agricultural waste (e.g., corn cobs or soybean hulls) or by teaming up with local communities to add food waste. These kinds of combination systems are called co-digestion. We talk more about that in a later section.

Much like wastewater treatment plants, farm-based anaerobic digesters use a natural process to break down manure into a sludge and biogas. The sludge can be separated out, and the liquid used as a fertilizer that retains all of the nutrients of fertilizer without nearly as much odor and the solid used as bedding for farm




"I'm going to be doing some testing of native clays in my studio," Rogers explains. "You can't stick a shovel in the ground here without turning up some sort of clay."

Rogers, an assistant professor of ceramics at East Tennessee State University (USA) has been using clay dug from the mountains of Western North Carolina and Eastern Tennessee since 2014.

And none of that clay is pottery-ready right out of the ground. It needs to be watered down, strained and dried, then tested in the kiln to determine colors, firing times and texture—you need a solid clay if you want your pots to hold up in a dishwasher.

"In this region, I've already found six or seven different clays that have different colors and other qualities," Rogers says.



What are the 2014 Sony hacks?

In late November, 2014, Sony Pictures Entertainment was hacked by a group calling itself the Guardians of Peace. The hackers, who are widely believed to be working in at least some capacity with North Korea, stole huge amounts of information off of Sony's network. They leaked the information to journalists, who wrote about embarrassing things Sony employees had said to each other.


Then the hackers, using one of their near-daily communiques via the website Pastebin, threatened to commit acts of terrorism against movie theaters, demanding that Sony cancel the planned release of *The Interview*, a comedy about two Americans who assassinate North Korean leader Kim Jong Un.

Initially, Sony reacted by shelving the movie. Critics, including President Obama, warned that capitulating in the face of terrorist threats would set a bad precedent. Then the studio reversed itself, releasing the movie in select theaters and online.

The US government says they have strong evidence that North Korea was responsible for the attack, though the North Korean regime has denied it. Security experts have criticized the weak evidence the FBI has released so far, but the National Security Agency reported has stronger evidence that it hasn't related for security reasons. The attack could have far-reaching consequences




Has the president protected a group of unauthorized immigrants from deportation before?

Yes. The Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program, or **DACA**, got expanded under the new changes, but it's been in place since 2012.

The program applies to many of the "DREAMers": young unauthorized immigrants who would have qualified for legalization under the **DREAM Act**.

Under the current DACA program, young unauthorized immigrants who meet certain criteria apply for two years of protection from deportation (it's going to be extended to three years under the new...
