Mission: protect the public, regulate lawful commerce in firearms and explosives, and provide global support

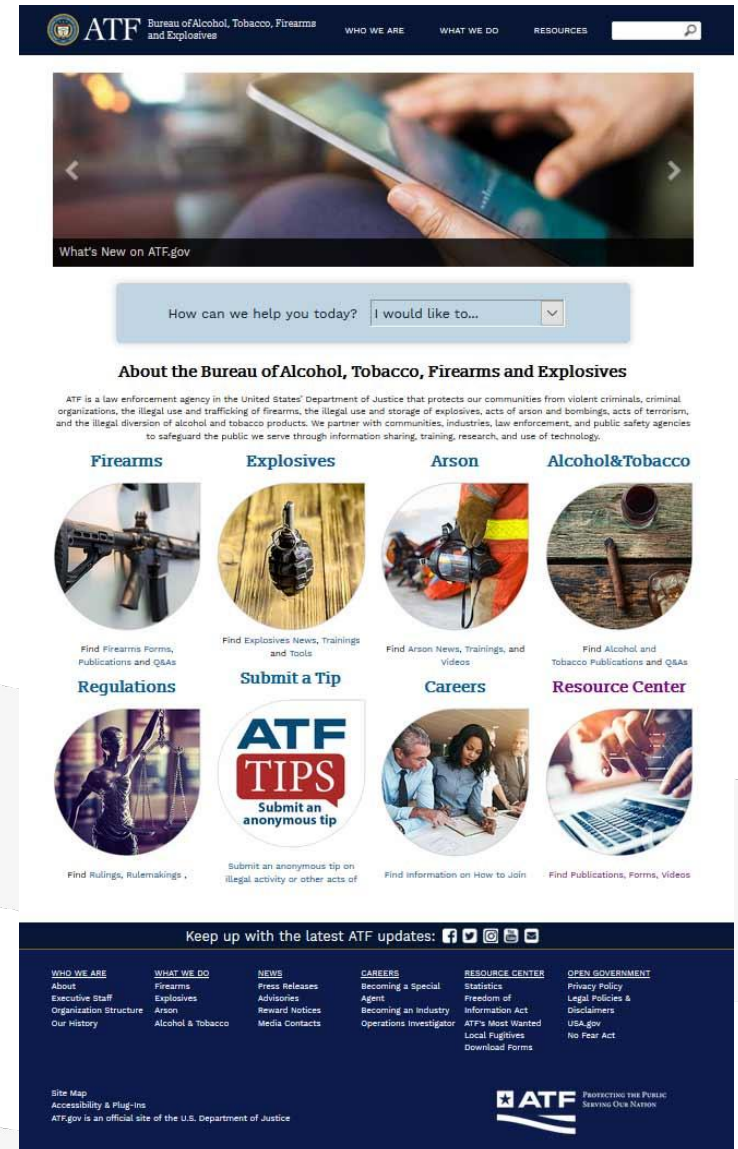


Law Enforcement & Regulatory Agency

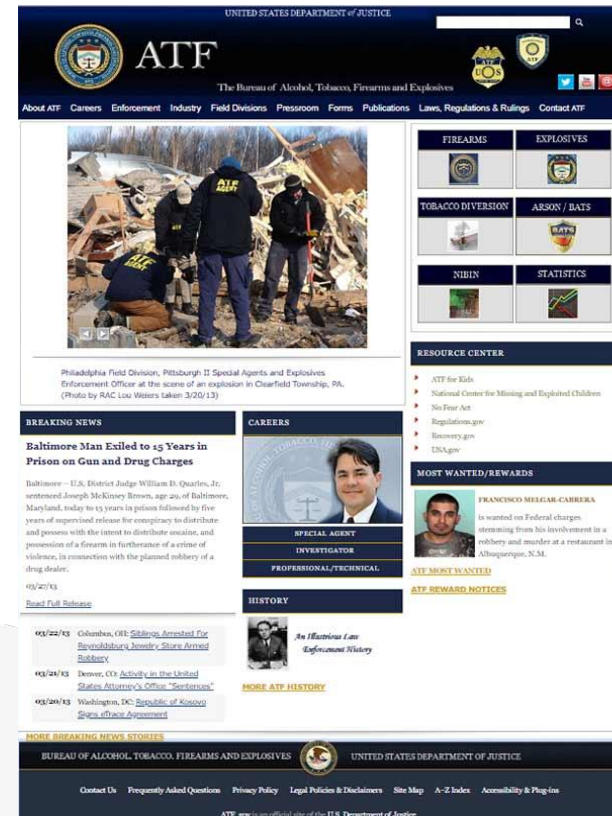

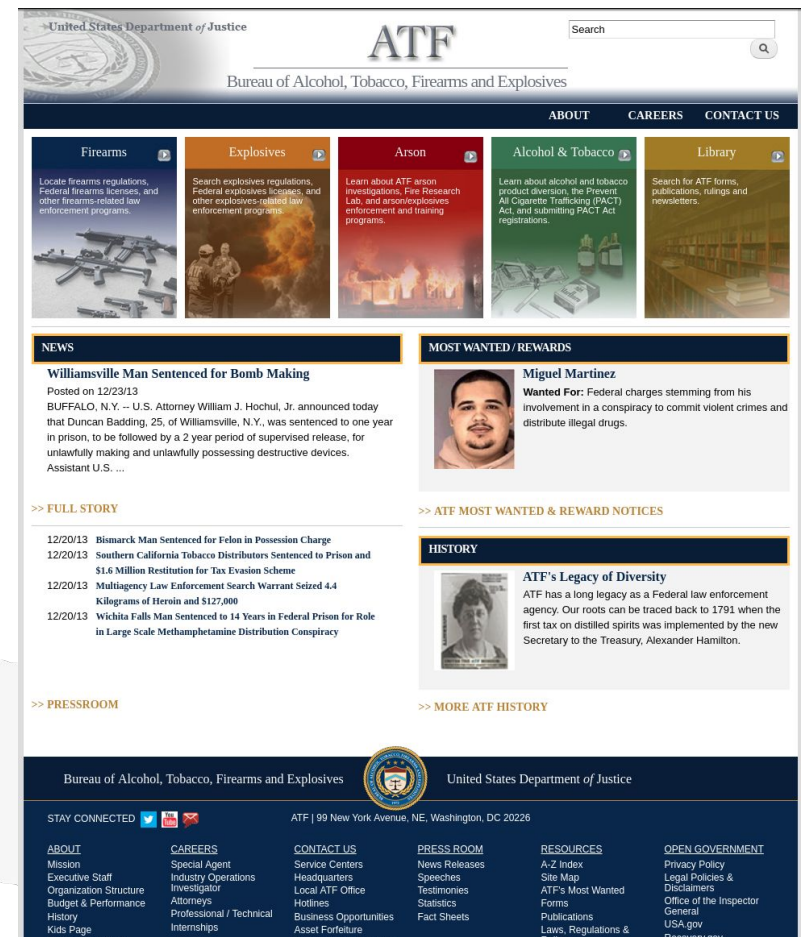

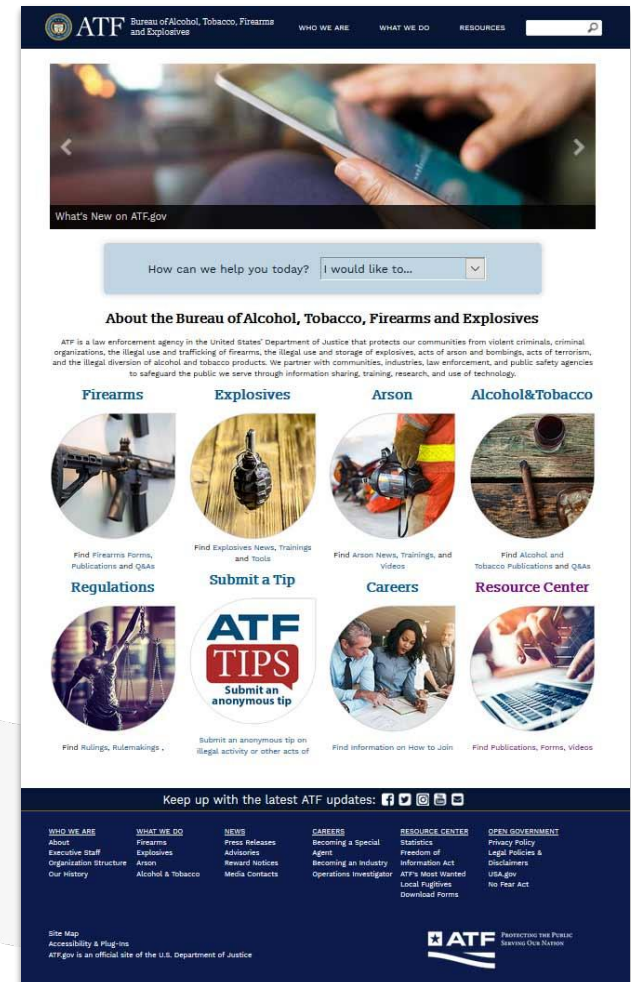

- Refined our use of analytics

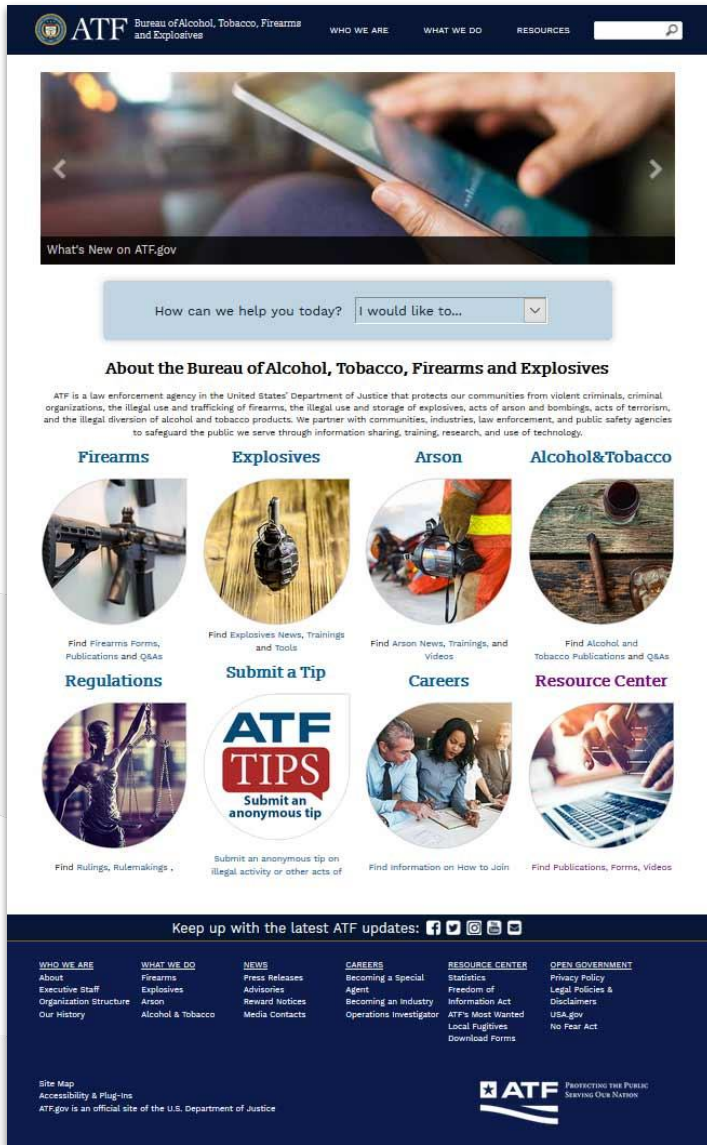

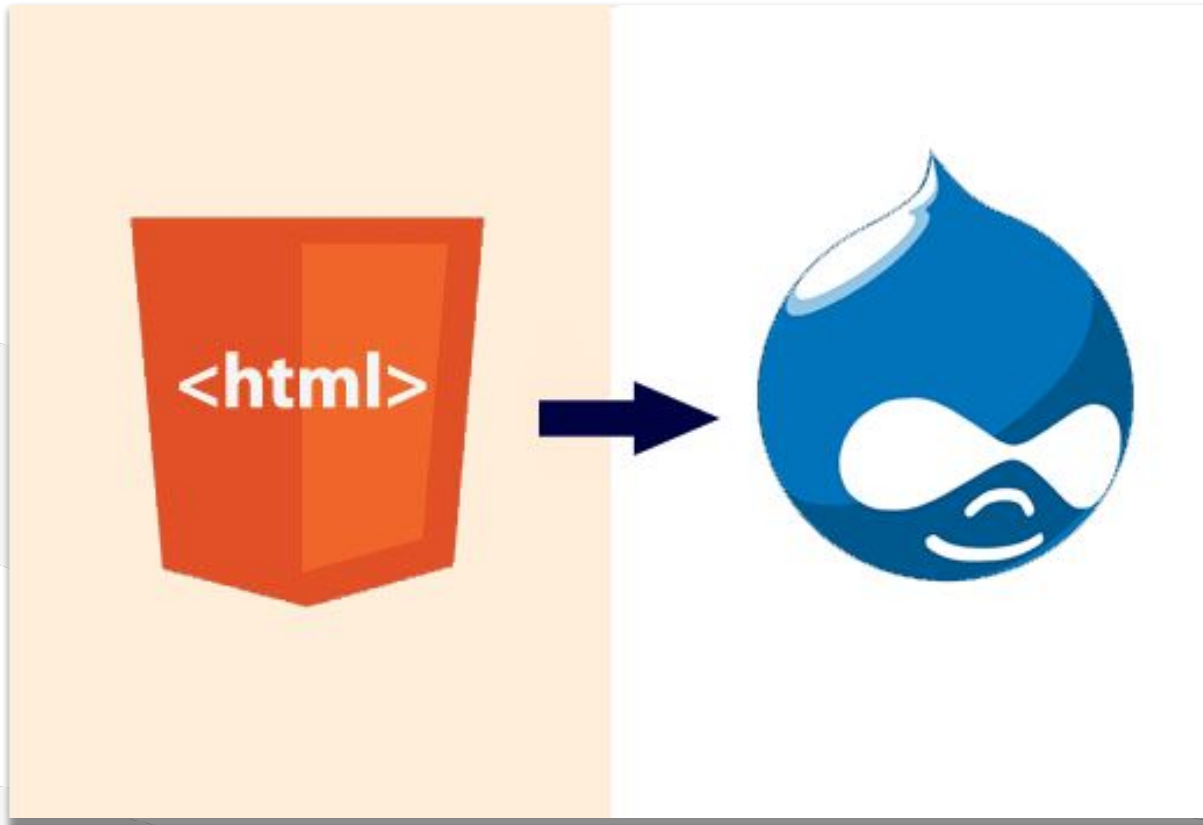

FAIL: Drupal Knowledge

- Resources 'technically' competent in NON-DRUPAL
- Learning in the job
- Built site in non-Drupal way
 - **HTML in Body field**

FAIL: PMs without Web Experience

- Experienced, dedicated, capable PMs
- No experience delivering websites
- Lack of organization
- No experience with CMS

FAIL: Weak Contract

- Vague deliverables
- No Drupal specifics in the contract



Drupal II

- RECOVERY
- Convince senior leadership that need to start from scratch
- Resulting in 2x spending
- Now had Drupal experience

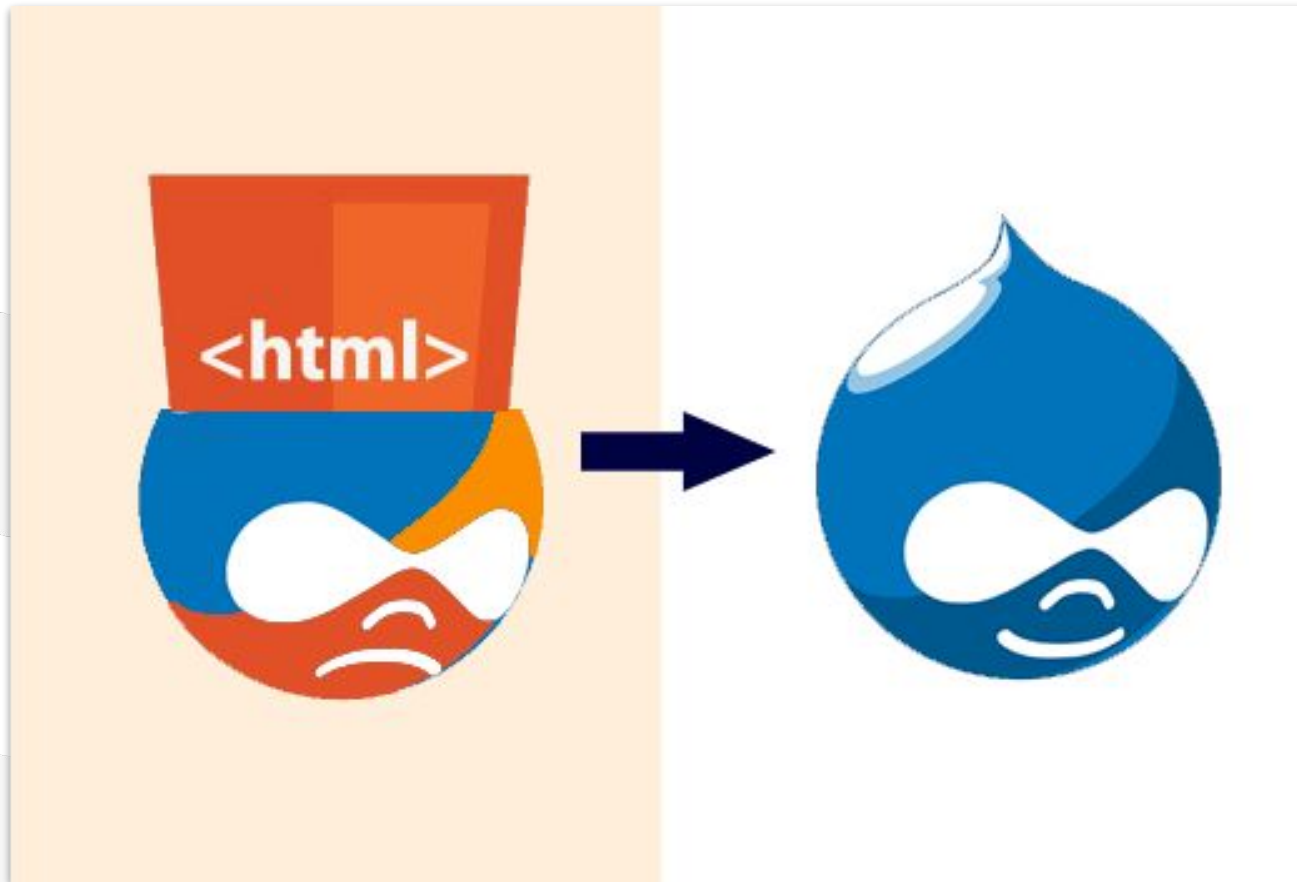

From Failure to Drupal



“Success is stumbling from failure to failure with no loss of enthusiasm”

LESSON: Drupal Expertise

- REQUIRED for success
- Must have senior Drupal architect
- Hire from outside
- Can grow team with mixed experience levels

LESSON: Project Managers

- Ideally two - one internal and one external
- MUST have website experience
- Good to have CMS experience
- Great to have Drupal experience
- Content migration experience



LESSON: Contract

- Write a contract specific to the project and technology
- Be specific
- Have Drupal and CMS experience staff assist with the creation of the contract
- Lock in skill requirements, rates, and options



LESSON: UX Integration

- Usability (user experience) study
- Migrate clean content
- Define your audience and understand it, hire experts to help if needed
- Focus on engagement
 - Utilizing GovDelivery (Granicus)



Multi-language

- Make translation a requirement upfront
- Drupal 7 - hard to integrate post launch
- Do your homework
 - Full vs Partial Site
 - Page and word counts
 - Staff prepared
- Experience - Drupal and Translation
- It takes longer than expected
- Same applies to 508



Infrastructure

- Cloud vs onsite
- Selecting Cloud Vendor
 - Fedramp
- Agency Rules
 - DNS
 - Managing Users (PIV)
 - Software approval
- Keys to success
 - Know the players
 - Leverage other agencies

Post Launch: What's Next?

Things to consider:

- Budget cuts
- Staffing
- New contracts (replacing professional services)
- Technology updates (including CMS, php, modules)
- Cybersecurity concerns
- CMS version upgrades
- Requirements changes
- Additional languages
- Documentation
