



MTA Ridership Data organizes the number of riders according to per station rather than train line so it was not possible to get the exact number of 2 / 3 train riders in total but they are broken down according to specific subway stations.



The stacked bar graph above was accumulated using MTA Ridership Data. We can see that compared to other stops of 2 / 3 subway lines, 135th subway station has relatively few riders per year.

But executed evictions only tell a part of the story. With the rent laws up for renewal in 2019, there is a need for data describing eviction filings, judgments, and warrants issued. These represent the three steps of the housing court process before an eviction warrant is executed, with displacement of rent regulated tenants occurring at each step.

While data access is important, there are negative consequences to unmitigated data transparency. Screening companies have long used OCA data feeds to erroneously measure landlord risk, leading to the proliferation of harmful tenant blacklists.






